PEERS SOCIAL SKILLS FOR YOUNG ADULTS

This evidence-based social skills program was developed at UCLA, specifically for young adults. Raneta is attending a train the trainer program in September and will train the staff in preparation for the beginning the program in Term 2 (February) Some topics that will be covered include:

- * Developing and maintaining friendships
- * Entering and exiting conversations
- * Appropriately use of humour
- Dating skills
- Handling direct and indirect bullying
- * Handling disagreements
- * Handling dating pressures

DANCE CLUB

A great opportunity to learn basic dance steps that can be used at Launch dances (when they come back) and family/social

events. This class will explore Salsa, line dances and maybe even some TikTok dances!

GLOBAL KNOWLEDGE + CURRENT EVENTS

COOKING CLASSES

Cooking is taught once per week for each class. Due to COVID precautions, students will not be cooking for groups. Each student will prepare only their own personal lunch. LUNCHES FROM HOME

Health and Safety is part of the Launch TASC Curriculum. We will be covering different parts of this section of the curriculum with a particular focus on COVID safety precautions. There will be review and practise on correctly donning and doffing masks, proper storage of masks, hand washing, what is a safe distance for social distancing etc.

COVID MITIGATIONS IN PLACE

Launch staff and students will be:

- Social Distancing
- Sitting behind individual "windshields" on desks
- Masking when not sitting behind the windshields
- Deep cleaning
- Enjoying enhanced air quality in classrooms

SHOPPING LIST

COVID precautions mean we are not sharing personal items again this year. This means there is some shopping for **YOU** to do prior to students returning to Launch. Returning students probably already still have some of these items from last year.

2 LOCATIONS OF LAUNCH

This year we wanted to have all of our students be able to attend Launch full time rather than alternating weeks.

To accomplish this, we have rented the "Old Brighton School" location with two separate, large classrooms. Students and staff who are assigned to the Old School location will have the use of the full kitchen and other facilities

Group S (for Stacey) and Group M (for Matt)

will be at 40 Wynford Dr, Unit 202 (known as Launch)

Group B (for Ben) and Group T (for Tania)

will be at 240 The Donway West (the "old Brighton School" location)

You will receive an individual email from Gwen letting you know which class and location your student will be assigned to.

DAILY SCREENING EMAILS

We are doing everything we can to keep students safe while they are attending Launch and that includes completing COVID screening forms prior to attendance each morning.

Screening forms will be sent to parents each morning at 7 AM. We ask that it be completed and submitted by 8:30 AM.

Students will not be able to enter Launch, in either location, if we have not received the form for that day.





REAL ECONOMY EXPLAINED

Touchless Real Economy continues for the 2021 - 2022 Launch year. Every student should have a working debit card or credit card when they start the year. Please set it up so it will ready to "tap" and does not need the PIN number.

It is recommended to have the card stay at Launch in the student's bin, that way students will be sure to have the card on Real Economy day. But if your student already has a card they safely carry with them at all times, we can work with that. Parents must ensure the bank account has enough money available in it to pay Real Economy fees each week. The Real Economy learning process of paying for expenses is devalued if a student is not successful in paying their expenses.

Expenses are different, depending on which program (FT, MWF or TWTh) your family has chosen. Look for your option below.

Full Time Real Economy \$25/week

Students will pay \$25/week for these essentials:

Art / Science Supply Kits: \$10

Lunch: \$10

Baking Class \$5

Additionally we recommend allocating another \$10 - \$20 per week for discretionary expenses such as:

- Snacks ordered online
- Optional items purchased online from Amazon, etc.
- Uber Eats, Pizza orders etc.

Part Time (M,W,F) RE \$15/week

Students will pay \$20/week for these essentials:

- Science supply kit: \$5
- Lunch: (Groups Ben & Stacey) \$10
- Baking Class \$5

Additionally we recommend allocating another \$10 - \$20 per week for discretionary expenses such as:

- Snacks ordered online
- Optional items purchased online from Amazon, etc.
- Uber Eats, Pizza orders etc.

Part Time (T,W,Th) RE \$15/week

Students will pay \$15/week for these essentials:

- Art Supply Kit: \$5
- Lunch: (Groups Tania & Matt) \$10

Additionally we recommend allocating another \$10 - \$20 per week for discretionary expenses such as:

- Snacks ordered online
- Optional items purchased online from Amazon, etc.
- Uber Eats, Pizza orders etc.

Please Note:

Real Economy fees this year are less than our regular Real Economy fees due to COVID restrictions. At least for the first term, we will not be travelling in the community or doing External Work Experience.

As soon as restrictions are lifted and we are able to safely add back in our External Work Experience, TTC, field trips and additional lunches, the Real Economy fee will increase. Families will be notified when we are returning to our regular Real Economy program.


